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

Arrival of the guests in Samarkand city by train

Visiting the Amir Timur Mausoleum

Note: The Mausoleum of Amir Timur, also known as Gur-e-Amir, is one of the most significant architectural landmarks in Samarkand. The construction of the mausoleum was started in 1404 by the great Sahibkiran Amir Temur and completed under Mirza Ulugbek. The structure is famous for its magnificent azure dome, intricate tilework, and grand entrance portal, reflecting the Timurid architectural style. Inside, the mausoleum houses a dark green jade tombstone, believed to mark Timur's grave. Gur-e-Amir not only inspired later Mughal architecture in India but also remains a symbol of Timur's enduring legacy.

Walk in Registan Square

Note: Registan Square is one of the most beautiful squares in the world, it is called the pearl of Central Asia. The square gained this fame thanks to the unique monuments of medieval oriental architecture surrounding it from three sides in the form of a beautiful architectural ensemble: Ulugbek Madrasah (1417-1420), Sher-Dor madrasah (1619-1636) and Tillya-Kari madrasah (1646-1647). This ensemble is considered the greatest among the buildings of the Islamic world.

Note: Family Park by Mirankul Group is a small city of entertainment and recreation. The territory of the park includes an ice palace, a multifunctional shopping and entertainment, family and leisure and sports complex, a cinema and more.

Visiting the Bibi-Khanim Mosque

Note: Mosque was built at the turn of the XIV-XV centuries in honor of Amir Timur's beloved wife. In total, the complex includes three mosques: a large main one with a blue dome and two small ones. The best masters of the East were invited for the construction and finishing works





Arriving at the Siab Bazaar

Note: To visit Samarkand and not visit the bazaar means to miss one of the most interesting adventures. The Oriental market is a very special environment where you can best feel the lively atmosphere of the ancient city. Many years ago, markets served as the main strategic objects of trade on the Great Silk Road. Siab Bazaar in Samarkand is one of the most interesting and ancient places of the city that every tourist should see.





A trip to "Khujum" Carpet Factory

17:30

Note: At this factory, you can get acquainted and observe the process of hand-made silk carpets, get acquainted with various samples of weaves and ancient ornaments, as well as order a unique product to your liking. The factory uses only natural dyes of indigo, madder, walnuts and pomegranate fruits. Young girls work here, coloring the threads themselves, completely perform all the laborious work to create an exclusive carpet.
