Glossary of Terms

State Environmental Expertise — the process of assessing the environmental impact of planned or ongoing activities and determining their compliance with environmental requirements.

Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) — a mechanism for identifying and evaluating the environmental consequences of a project or activity in advance.

Strategic Environmental Assessment (SEA) — the process of evaluating the environmental impacts of state programs, strategies, and plans.

Public Hearings — a process through which citizens and stakeholders express their opinions and comments on projects or decisions.

Aarhus Convention — an international agreement establishing rights related to access to environmental information, public participation in decision-making, and access to justice.

Compliance — a control system aimed at ensuring adherence to legislation and internal regulations.

Digital Government — a set of information systems designed to provide public services in electronic form.

Personal Account — a secure electronic page that allows users to track the status of applications, requests, and services.
