



NAMANGAN REGION - CENTER OF FOLK CRAFT







Namangan region is the historical region of Uzbekistan. This fact is confirmed by numerous archaeological digging and constructions which are able to tell about the lifestyle of the early settlements, about the monuments of Stone and Bronze ages.

Archaeologists found whole areas in the northern part of the city of Chust, relating to culture of population of 1 millennium B.C. In 4 - 3 centuries B.C. In the territory of Kasansay region during the existence of the Kushan kingdom, the city turns into the capital where the economy and crafts were developed.

27 historical objects and holy places are located in the area.

It includes the Mullo-Kirgiz madrassah, mosques of Ota Valikhon Tura and Sheikh Ishok Ishon, craft workshops and many others.

Since olden times, the administrative center of the region Namangan was considered as a city of flowers, and the region in the whole as the land of finest gardeners and wine-growers.

One of the popular cities of the Namangan region is Chust that is famous for knives craft. From the earliest times these knives have great popularity not only in the republic, but beyond its outside.
